1. Working hours:

From 8 am to 4 pm from Monday to Friday with one hour lunch break.

2. Meals:

Breakfast and lunch are provided by the ministry of education, although we bring our own lunchbox and we are entitled to clean it once home.

3. Religion:

We are working with people from different religion in the foundation, although in the school the catholic ideology is taught. Please make sure to respect that.

4. Visa:

For short stay (less than 30 days) a visa will not be necessary, but you will have to acquire a tourism card. This card can be bought at the airport at your arrival and cost approximately 10USD (don't forget to bring change).

For longer stay, contact the closest Dominican republic consulate to get informed on the needed documents to acquire the proper visa entitled for the status of volunteer.



5. Permissions and days off

For a permission to be valid, it is mandatory to solicit and inform the volunteering program coordinator at least 48h in advance. The hours not worked will have to be completed another day.

6. Dress code:

Must be suitable for a school: without cleavage, trousers too shorts or skirts above the knees. We recommend closed shoes (ballet pump are acceptable). Clothes should cover tattoos, and piercing. We will provide you shirts as uniform.

7. Events:

Five times a year the foundation is celebrating events to raise money, you can be asked to participate to those events.

9. Housing:

Free housing is offered to every volunteer who will live in a house inside one of our campus, with basic services.

In the same school live a group of nuns as well as one of the school directors, it is consequently asked to behave with respect of essential communal living norms.

What could interest you?

10. Transportation:

We can ensure your transportation from the airport to the school at your arrival.

Transportations between the different campus schools are insured by the foundation (working hours).

11. Health insurance:

The organization cannot take in charge medical insurances for its volunteers. We recommend you to take special disposition with your current medical insurance and to inform them of your trip or to contract a specific health insurance (in case of long stay). ARS Universal and ARS Palic are the two insurance company recommended for foreigners in DR.

12. Vaccines:

Please check on the Ministry of Foreign Affairs website of your country if specific vaccination is recommended. You can also consult your doctor in case of doubts.

13. Flights and airports:

The closest airport are:

- La Romana (few flights)
- Las Américas, Santo Domingo
- Punta Cana



For your information

We recommend you to:

- Leave windows closed to avoid cockroach, spiders and mosquitos from coming inside the house, unless using mosquito nets.
- Not to take a walk in the streets of La Romana during the night
- Don't drink tap water
- Bring your own medication for diarrhea, as a foreigner there is great chance you will face digestive problem at first.


